# Warren Water Striders Partner w/ Onion Bag Project

In 2024, Warren Co SWCD created the Warren Water Striders kayaking program. Curtis became involved with the Onion Bag Project through the veterans group Paddle for Heroes who had started the program on the Kokosing River. The project snow balled and three years ago The Onion Bag Litter Prevention Project was born. It started out with 40 boxes from Paddle for Heroes and has grown to 215 boxes in 5 states. Curtis has 5 very dedicated directors and many volunteers that maintain boxes and assist in river sweeps and litter pickups. They pick up litter at over 20 river access points including miles of road close to the access points. They participate in river cleanups on the Little Miami, Kokosing, Great Miami, Buck Creek, Olentangy, Alum Creek, Walhonding, Muskingum, as well as organizing cleanups on the Tuscarawas And Mohican rivers. Curtis does this work because he likes his rivers clean when he paddles. When asked, Curtis replied "I do it because it is fun. I do it because someone has to. "Warren Co.
